Dementia - Alzheimer's Disease

Alzheimer's disease is the most common form of dementia. It is a disease that causes memory loss and affects other cognitive abilities serious enough to interfere with daily life.



Every 67 seconds, someone in the United States develops Alzheimer's disease. By mid-century that number is estimated to increase to one person every 33 seconds.

Alzheimer's disease is the 6th leading cause of death in the United States. There is no known treatment or cure for Alzheimer's.

Over 70% of people with Alzheimer's disease live at home and over 20% live at home alone.

Over 8,500 people in Waukesha County have Alzheimer's disease.
