

**IN THE MATTER OF:  
APPROVAL OF THE OPERATIONAL  
PLAN FOR THE VILLAGE OF  
MENOMONEE FALLS MUNICIPAL  
COURT PROCEEDINGS**

---

**WHEREAS**, the Menomonee Falls Municipal Court is currently subject to Wisconsin Supreme Court’s April 15, 2020 amended order “IN RE THE MATTER OF REMOTE HEARINGS DURING THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC”; and.

**WHEREAS**, the Municipal Court Judge has submitted to the Chief Judge of the Third Judicial Administrative District, the Operational Plan for the Municipal Court In-person Proceedings; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Chief Judge of the Third Judicial Administrative District has full administrative authority over the municipal courts in the Third Judicial Administrative District, under SCR 70.20(2), subject to the administrative control of the Wisconsin Supreme Court; and

**WHEREAS**, the Chief Judge of the Third Judicial Administrative District has the duty, under the Wisconsin Supreme Court’s May 22, 2020 order “IN RE THE MATTER OF THE EXTENSION OF ORDERS AND INTERIM RULE CONCERNING CONTINUATION OF JURY TRIALS, SUSPENSION OF STATUTORY DEADLINES FOR NON-CRIMINAL JURY TRIALS, AND REMOTE HEARINGS DURING THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC”, to review and approve the Operational Plan submitted by the Municipal Court or to require that the Municipal Court follow a circuit court’s or municipal court’s operational plan that the Chief Judge has approved; and,

**WHEREAS**, the Chief Judge has reviewed the Operational Plan submitted by the Municipal Court In-person Proceedings and finds that it includes requirements for requiring the use of face coverings for all individuals present in the courtroom, appropriate social distancing, plans for sanitation, cleaning, hygiene, and appropriate signage.

**THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED** that the Operational Plan for the Menomonee Falls Municipal Court In-person Proceedings is approved and that the Wisconsin Supreme Court’s April 15, 2020 amended order “IN RE THE MATTER OF REMOTE HEARINGS DURING THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC” ceases to apply in that Municipal Court.
