PAYMENT INFORMATION

Due to COVID-19, in-person tax collections at the Waukesha County Treasurer's Office may be suspended this year.

Four Ways to Pay Taxes:

Paying with a personal check or escrow check? Make checks payable to the Waukesha County Treasurer. Remember to endorse any escrow checks made payable to you and the County Treasurer

Electronically from checking acct.= \$1.50 fee
Credit or debit card=2.39% of payment amount
- **MAIL**
(a self-addressed envelope is enclosed for your convenience)

SECOND INSTALLMENT PAYMENTS—due on July 31. Use the envelope provided if mailing or using the Waukesha County drop box. Pay on-line at tax.waukeshacounty.gov

TAX RECEIPTS

Tax receipts for payments will automatically be **mailed within 2-3 weeks**. Please **DO NOT** enclose a self-addressed envelope as it slows down the receipt process.

TAX REFUNDS

Tax refund checks, if necessary, will be issued **4-5 weeks after receipt of payment**.

LICENSE THEM

The Village of Menomonee Falls requires all dogs, 5 months and older, to be licensed every year and to have a current rabies vaccine.

\$10 per dog if spayed/neutered

\$15 per dog if not spayed/neutered

REASONS TO LICENSE YOUR PET:

- It greatly improves your chance of getting your animal back if it goes missing.
- It lets law enforcement know your animal is up to date on its rabies vaccine.
- Animal license fees fund animal cruelty, abuse and neglect investigations.
- State Law & Village Ordinance required dogs to be licensed.

Currently, the Menomonee Falls Neighborhood Watch is comprised of over 160 Block Watch Groups and has coverage of over 4500 households.

The ABC's of Neighborhood Watch:

- Any community member can join – renter, homeowner or business owner.
- A watch can be formed around any geographical unit: a block, apartment building, or business
- Members receive a Police Crime update via E-mail
- Members receive home/business security surveys and learn how to make their homes or businesses more secure
- Members can meet with the Police Department on crime, neighborhood problems and various other topics
- Members learn what types of activity is suspicious and how to report that information
- Members receive Neighborhood Watch window clings and stickers
- Members work with the Police Department to solve community problems and deny the opportunity for crime
- Members work with the Police Department to solve community problems
- Members can purchase a Neighborhood Watch Sign for their neighborhood /sub-division and a "We Support Our Police" sign for their lawns
