Dog Licenses

2020 dog licenses expired December 31, 2020. To license your dog, submit a completed [Application for Dog License](#) and a \$10 fee per dog (\$15 for unneutered/unspayed dogs) to the Clerk Services Department. After March 31, fees increase to \$15 for neutered/spayed dogs and \$20 for unneutered/unspayed dogs.

Drainage Complaints

Projects large and small, (including backyard projects and changes in landscaping) may alter the way that water moves across residential properties. Drainage problems range in nature from property flooding to home flooding and include such concerns as erosion and problems associated with sump pump discharges. If you are experiencing drainage problems, please complete the Drainage Complaint Form and someone from the Engineering Department will contact you to set up a meeting to investigate the situation. Fire Hydrant Flushing

The Village flushes fire hydrants twice each year in spring and fall and throughout the year if necessary.

Hydrant flushing:

- Improves water quality
- Exercises hydrants so they are in good functioning order when needed for an emergency
- Removes sediment that may cause discolored water
- Allows us to inspect each hydrant for defects

If you experience discoloration in your water, we recommend running the cold water for several minutes to help clear the discoloration before using it for drinking or laundry.

Spring is a great time to clean up the yard, organize the garage, and dispose of unwanted items. The Menomonee Falls Public Works Department goes about these activities every spring at a much larger scale than the typical property owner. On top of keeping the centralized Public Works facility in order, the department cares for hundreds of acres of park lands, maintains all Village properties and equipment, and administers disposal initiatives across Menomonee Falls. Read on to learn more about Village initiatives and services that support spring cleaning for property owners and the community at-large.

Bulk Item Collection

Waste Management will be conducting a bulk trash collection week again in 2021. Bulk trash includes items that don't fit in the garbage cart, exceed four feet in length, or 60 pounds in weight. This collection includes up to two bulk items placed at the curbside for pickup free of charge. This will occur the first full week of May (week of May 3rd). Residents looking to utilize this service need to notify Waste Management between April 12th and April 26th about their items for pick-up by calling 262-251-4000. Bulk items must be placed curbside for collection on your regularly scheduled garbage day. This bulk collection does not include hazardous waste, yard waste, tires, or electronics. Brush Collection Week

The Menomonee Falls Public Works Department will begin picking up brush on Monday, May 10th.

- Brush materials acceptable for Village pickup are **branches up to six inches in diameter**, cut to a **maximum length of four feet**.
- Brush must be placed on the terrace area (between the curb and sidewalk). In areas without curb, the brush should be placed on the grass area adjacent to the street pavement or adjacent to driveway entrances. All areas should have brush placed parallel to the road.
- For safety reasons, no brush may be placed on the street pavement.
- Please note: yard waste, including grass clippings, leaves, and garden debris will not be picked up.
- No stumps, roots, or shrubs with intact root balls will be picked up.
- Any yard waste that is mixed in with your branches will not be picked up.
- Brush in containers will not be picked up, as too often there is yard waste in the bottom of the container. We encourage you to use your Yard Waste Permit and take yard waste debris (not picked up) to the Orchard Ridge composting facility. Be aware that the Orchard Ridge composting facility will no longer accept cash and accepts all major credit cards and checks.

The deadline for residents to put out brush for pickup is Sunday, May 9th.

Spring Cleaning Continued...

Yard Waste Permits

New in 2021, Yard Waste Permits were mailed in February to each Menomonee Falls property owner. The permit allows residents to dispose of yard waste 35 times in a season (April – November) for no fee at the Orchard Ridge composting facility (watch for the scale house on the west side of the road). Please note: Village residents must provide identification showing proof of Menomonee Falls residency. Have your ID ready to show the scale house attendant upon arrival. If you do not arrive with a permit, all fees will be charged. All businesses are excluded from this program.

- Acceptable forms of payment include credit card or check – cash no longer accepted
- Residents will be allowed one free visit per day
After the free visit, additional yard waste will be charged at a rate of \$0.015 per pound, minimum of \$3.00.
- Hours of Operation: Monday through Friday, 6:30 am – 4 pm & Saturday 7 am – 11:45 am
- No large stumps or logs over 6" will be accepted

Menomonee River Cleanup

After having to cancel the event in 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Spring River Cleanup is back on for 2021! Come join us this spring on April 24th to clean up the parks and rivers of Menomonee Falls. Every year since 2008, around Earth Day in April, the community has gathered to clean up the parks and rivers of Menomonee Falls. This event is organized by the Milwaukee Riverkeepers and is sponsored by Waste Management. Social distancing and face masks will be required for this event, and all participants must be preregistered. Please visit menomoneefalls.org/rivercleanup

Why are Village Streets Swept?

Street sweeping is done to clear debris left by winter snowplowing, to keep storm drains free of obstruction, and to help prevent pollutants from entering the drainage system. The sweeping is not intended to remove leaves placed in the street by property owners. Leaves from private properties should be mulched and left on the lawn, or bagged and taken to the Orchard Ridge Landfill with a Yard Waste Permit.

2020 Year in Review

Despite the COVID-19 pandemic, 2020 was a strong year for new development and redevelopment projects across all sectors. The Village issued a total of 934 building permits, and the total estimated construction value of projects in Menomonee Falls was over \$123 million. Single family home construction/remodeling (\$52 million) and industrial projects (\$29 million) contributed the most to overall value.

Residential

- 110 new single family home and duplex units
- 98 new apartment units
- 16 senior apartments
- 715 residential renovations/additions



Commercial

- 3 new buildings
- 41 commercial renovations/additions
- Estimated construction value of **\$8.9 million**



Institutional

- 3 new buildings
- 20 institutional renovations/additions
- Estimated construction value of **\$13.9 million**



Industrial

- 1 new building
- 25 industrial renovations/additions
- Estimated construction value of **\$28.8 million**



Menomonee Falls led all communities in southeastern Wisconsin with 106 new single family homes constructed in 2020. The Village also issued the highest number of residential building permits on record (825) in 2020 and construction moved forward on major job centers with projects at Milwaukee Tool, Leonardo DRS, Ascension hospital, and Glenroy incorporated.

- **New construction value of nearly \$123.5 million**
- **Most residential building permits ever issued** (including renovations) **825 permits**
- **106 single family homes** and 4 duplex units were approved
- **59 lots for single family homes** were approved in Final Plats
- **Industrial projects totaling nearly \$28.8 million** (the highest value in the last decade)
- Creation of a **community event space** at **Village Park**

Introducing MFDI

In early 2021, a new 501(c)(6) nonprofit organization was established with the aim of growing downtown Menomonee Falls as a vibrant, exciting, and safe destination for everyone to enjoy. The Menomonee Falls Downtown Inc. (MFDI) Board includes representatives from downtown businesses, community organizations, the Chamber of Commerce, and the Village of Menomonee Falls. MFDI is taking the lead in coordinating programs at Village Park and throughout downtown. MFDI's nonprofit status gives the organization the ability to fundraise, establish sponsorships, and run vendor operations for downtown events.

The first major task for MFDI is the coordination of safe downtown events in the midst of the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic. MFDI has established several committees and has been planning for downtown events, marketing, and sponsorships. With the Village Park areas available for the first time, MFDI has been busy working with the Village and community organizations to schedule and establish events in the new space. 2021 programing at Village Park and throughout downtown will include a summer concert series, festivals, the farmers market, a beer garden, shopping promotions, and holiday events.

While the snow piled up this winter, the farmers market was making plans to continue supporting small, local farms and vendors by providing a viable, vibrant marketplace for them to sell their farm-fresh produce and hand-made products directly to the consumer. Unlike your grocery store, a farmers market supports farmers selling locally-grown and seasonal produce, while providing a wholesome event for residents that nourishes and fosters community. And this year—they are excited to do all of this in a beautiful, new location.

"There are a lot of logistics to setting up a Farmers Market so we can provide the best visitor and vendor experience possible," said Ann Wanke, Greater Menomonee Falls Foundation Farmers Market manager. "And with the opening of the new plaza at Village Park, the Menomonee Falls farmers market will have more capacity, more flexibility, and a gorgeous location for it to take place."

Village Park, at Appleton Avenue and Garfield Drive in the heart of Downtown Menomonee Falls, was redeveloped in 2020 as a community destination to include space for outdoor markets and events. The drawing shown below proposes opportunities for placing vendor tents and food trucks in a charming outdoor environment which features a walkway, gathering space with tables and umbrellas, restroom area with a covered gathering area, and convenient parking.

The market season will begin on June 2 with Wednesday hours from 2 pm – 6 pm. **Newly added for 2021 is the Sunday market.** The Sunday market will be open on 10 am – 1 pm during the height of the growing season, from July 11 – September 12.



Meet Your New Police Chief

A Letter from Chief Mark Waters



Chief Waters was sworn in as Menomonee Falls' seventh Police Chief on February 11, 2021

I was born and raised in Milwaukee attending and subsequently graduating from the Milwaukee Public School system. As a result of my father being a Milwaukee Police Officer, I had an interest in the criminal justice system from a very early age. As a result, my undergraduate education endeavor took me to the University Wisconsin at Milwaukee (UWM).

In order to finance my own education, while a student at UWM, I enlisted in the United States Army Reserve (USAR). When I first enlisted in the USAR, I envisioned this as only a means to earn income for a brief period while going to school, but my motivation transitioned from financial to that of service and patriotism. I found myself 20 years later retiring from the USAR as a major.

While an undergraduate student, I pursued employment as a law enforcement officer. Prior to graduating from UWM, I was hired as a deputy sheriff at the Milwaukee County Sheriff's Office. While working at the Sheriff's Office, I continued my studies at UWM and eventually earned my bachelor's degree in criminal justice. After a few years at the sheriff's department, I recognized that a municipal police department would be a better fit for me as my desire was to serve as traditional police officer in a community. After four years at the sheriff's department, I had opportunities to work for either the City of Brookfield or the Village of Menomonee Falls. Between the two, I chose the Village of Menomonee Falls Police Department (MFPD), where I have now worked for the past 28+ years.

While at the MFPD, I have served in virtually every area of the department. However, my most rewarding time was that of a late shift (11:00 p.m. – 7:00 a.m.) patrol officer in the 1990's. For it was there and then that I was able to be what I always strived to be, a local neighborhood police officer working side by side with some of the finest officers ever to wear the badge. This is not to say that other aspects of my career were not rewarding as well. Other than my fondness for late shift patrol, I very much enjoyed my time as the Department Training Officer. I relished the opportunity to increase both the quantity and quality of training at the department.

As a life-long learner, I have pursued advanced training and education throughout my career. The highlight of my police training career was the FBI National Academy in 2009. Educationally, I am an alumnus of both UWM and Marquette universities. Upon graduation, from Marquette I was fortunate to be offered a position as an adjunct instructor at Marquette where I have been teaching criminal justice for the past thirteen years.

I look forward to continuing to serve the residents of Menomonee Falls as your Chief. I am committed to continuing to promote the concepts of community policing and community engagement by the department. We will remain a professional department that provides a high level of service treating everybody with dignity and respect.

Personnel Changes

New Equipment

Menomonee Falls Fire Department placed a new ladder truck, designated as 2772, in service on January 1st. It is technically called a quint, as it has a pump, hose, and a tank for water in addition to ground ladders and the aerial device. It was designed with water in mind as it has the ability to flow up to 3,000 gallons of water per minute through the dual monitors mounted on the bucket. It was built in Appleton by Pierce Manufacturing.

The ambulance fleet was modernized by the addition of a 2020 Horton modular ambulance on a Ford F Series four wheel drive chassis. This newest ambulance has the added feature of tinted windows in the patient care compartment to protect the patient's privacy.

The Menomonee Falls Fire Department is constantly striving to serve the residents and visitors with outstanding service, answering the call with: "How Can We Help?"

As the Ice Melts: A Spring Safety Reminder

It is true that April showers bring May flowers, but spring rains also bring areas of open water that were ice covered in the Village. The changes in the weather can make any ice unable to safely be traveled on. Please exercise caution for a number of reasons.



The first reason is hypothermia. Falling through the ice makes a person more vulnerable to hypothermia from heat loss. A person will lose body heat 25-30 times faster if they are wet or submerged in water. It is also reasonable to assume the water temperature could be much lower than the air temperature. This is due to the snow melt adding to the water at just above freezing and the fact that it takes more time for the water to warm up due to its mass.

The second reason is the speed of moving water. Added snow melt will make the moving bodies of water move faster and have greater volume. This increases the force of the moving water acting on an object or person in the moving water adding to the risk.

A cubic foot of water weighs about 62 pounds. Imagine walking in a pond that is six inches deep. Now imagine walking in a pond that is 12 inches deep. It takes more effort. Now take into account the speed you, or the water is traveling at. The force is multiplied by the speed you are running at, or the speed the water is moving at. The increase in force is geometric, meaning at 4 MPH, a brisk walking pace, it has a force of roughly 66 pounds per square foot. If the speed is doubled to 8 MPH, the force increases to 264 pounds per square foot, a four fold increase. If that water is up to a car's door, it is strong enough to move that car!!
