Seasonal Reminders & Service Updates

Park Basics

Menomonee Falls maintains [16 public parks](#) which provide a wide variety of recreation opportunities for residents and visitors. Park users should abide by the following rules:

- Hours 6 am to a half hour after sunset, unless otherwise posted
- Dogs allowed in Menomonee Falls park system on a leash not exceeding 6 feet in length. Owners are responsible for picking up after dogs
- No alcohol consumption without permit
- No alcohol in athletic field areas
- No littering, removal of vegetation, disorderly conduct, or amplified broadcast beyond 20 feet
- Fires permitted in grills only. Grills are provided in Rotary Park and Mill Pond Park only. Charcoal must be properly disposed of
- Tents may be erected only with the prior approval of the Village (and may require a permit)
- No moonwalks, bounce houses, inflatable structures, or slip & slides
- Power strips and extension cords are prohibited within picnic shelters

Park Shelter Reservations

All park reservations are limited to Menomonee Falls residents and must be made in person at Village Hall. For further information please call 262-532-4200 or visit menomonee-falls.org/parkreservations

Yard Waste Permits

New in 2021, Yard Waste Permits were mailed in February to each Menomonee Falls property owner. The permit allows residents to dispose of yard waste 35 times in a season (April – November) for no fee at the Orchard Ridge Composting Facility (watch for the scale house on the west side of the road). Please note: Village residents must provide identification showing proof of Menomonee Falls residency. Have your ID ready to show the scale house attendant upon arrival. If you do not arrive with a permit, all fees will be charged. All businesses are excluded from this program.

The 2021 Orchard Ridge Composting Facility Program is located at W124N9355 Boundary Road.

- Acceptable forms of payment include credit card or check – cash no longer accepted.
- Residents will be allowed one free visit per day. After the free visit, additional yard waste will be charged at a rate of \$0.015 per pound, minimum of \$3.00.
- Hours of operation: Monday through Friday, 6:30 am – 4 pm & Saturday 7 am – 11:45 am
- No large stumps or logs over 6" will be accepted.

If you did not receive (or misplaced) a Yard Waste Permit, stop by Village Hall with identification/documentation proving that you are a Menomonee Falls resident to receive a replacement.

Free Mulch!

The Village manages a brush grinding operation which produces shredded wood mulch for residents. The mulch is FREE, clean, and good quality. Menomonee Falls residents can help themselves to mulch at the self-serve location at the end of MacArthur Drive through the end of October. Business Expansion Update

- Milwaukee Tool is constructing a 121,635 square foot research and development building on Leatherwood Court (east of Flint Drive in the Woodland Prime office park)
- Construction is nearly complete on Glenroy Incorporated's 121,000 square foot addition along Megal Drive.
- Construction is nearly complete on Ascension's 32,000 square foot hospital along Main Street near Interstate 41/US 45.

Lead Water Service Lateral Replacement Program


Leveraging State Resources to Ensure Public Safety

As part of the approved 2021 Village Budget, the Village of Menomonee Falls will be proceeding with a project to replace existing private lead water service laterals with new water service laterals in an effort to reduce the potential health hazards associated with lead water service piping.

This project is being funded with help from the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources (DNR). The Village of Menomonee Falls applied for and received state assistance through the Safe Drinking Water Loan Program. This program will provide a forgivable loan of about \$1.1 million to the Village for lead piping to be removed from over 200 private laterals in Menomonee Falls.

The water service lateral is the pipe that provides water from the water main in the street to a home or business (see diagram). The program will fund the complete replacement of private lead laterals for all residential (including multi-family and mixed-use properties), Pre-K-12 schools, and licensed daycare center properties. The program will also fund any restoration work associated with the replacement construction at no cost to the property owner.

As a reminder, your water meets all federal guidelines for safety, and the Village of Menomonee Falls will ensure it remains that way. Lead can enter the water as a result of the wearing away of materials containing lead in service lines or internal plumbing. Fewer than 2% of Menomonee Falls Water Utility service lines are made of lead, but as long as lead water service piping is left in place, the potential for lead exposure will remain. This project will greatly reduce the amount of lead piping, and therefore reduce the chances of lead entering the water system.

After 28 years of setting up in a parking lot, the Menomonee Falls Farmers Market is delighted to settle into their handsome, well-appointed home in the newly renovated Village Park.

The 2021 market season will open **Wednesday, June 2, from 2 pm until 6 pm, through October 13**. Visitors can stroll throughout the gracious walkway of the plaza which will be lined by vendors' booths. Shoppers will find the expected as well as the unexpected: not only locally-grown, fresh produce and flowers, homemade bakery, eggs, microgreens, honey, maple syrup, meats and fish ... but also, fresh-roasted nuts, gourmet popsicles, fried pork rinds, spice mixes, bath and body products, art, jewelry, kettle corn, homemade pet treats, and unique prepared foods ready to enjoy. In addition to the new location, the 2021 season will feature a **Sunday Market, open from 10 am – 1 pm during the peak growing season from July 11 through September 12**.

Dana Newman, market manager, says, "This is a well-designed park with additional points of entry for visitors and space for more vendors. The park is designed to be a centerpiece of social activity, and connects to the vibrancy and charm of the Downtown business district.

Tables, umbrellas and restrooms will be handy for everyone's convenience." To add to the experience, the Downtown Beer Garden ("The Garden" in Village Park) will be open from 5 pm – 9 pm on Wednesdays starting on June 2nd.

Falls Cable Access: Amplifying Local Voices & Looking to the Future

Since the 1980's, Falls Cable Access (FCAC) has been a voice for Menomonee Falls. Covering local events of all kinds – from athletics to music to academics and more, the channel strives to find innovative ways to lift up the stories of Menomonee Falls' businesses, individuals, and community organizations by being ever-present in current activities, anchored to the village's past, and unafraid to adapt to the future.

The channel is currently directed by Chris Forston, who stepped into his role after the retirement of longtime director Harry Stoetzel in 2019. Forston has had big shoes to fill during his two years with FCAC but says he has been overwhelmed by the outpouring of support from the community. "I entered [FCAC] supported by a very talented group of historians, producers, and writers, and backed by the best board members [I] could ask for," Forston says.

Forston's previous position with West Bend's cable access channel prepared him well for his current role in Menomonee Falls. "I've learned that the most important thing is to be always present in the community and facilitate everyone's voice." To do this, Forston moved to make FCAC's productions tighter and more mobile. New cameras and miniaturized streaming devices allow Forston and crew to go live on Facebook and YouTube instantly, and FCAC can cover more events with fewer staff.

This downsize in equipment means that FCAC was also recently able to move out of their offices on St. Francis Dr. and into a new space inside Village Hall, a move that Forston is very excited about. "Everything scheduled in the village comes right out of [Village Hall]," he says, "We'll have our finger on the pulse of everything happening in the Falls."

While the coronavirus pandemic of 2020 upended many of FCAC's plans, Forston says that a silver lining was being able to re-strengthen FCAC's relationship with community voices. Seeking a mouthpiece to Falls residents, organizations ranging from the Optimist Club to Menomonee Falls Downtown Inc. to the school district reached out to FCAC to get their announcements and events broadcast in a virtual way. This led to new shows and programming for FCAC's broadcasts and social media channels. "Focus on the Falls" partners with the school district and highlights opportunities for academics, athletics, and student health; "Business Works Here" spotlights local businesses; "The Village" covers Village of Menomonee Falls departments/services, and "Trips and Tales" is a new children's show in collaboration with the Menomonee Falls Public Library.

In addition, FCAC began producing its own social media content, often highlighting Falls history. The "Evolve" photo series combines black & white photos from the village's past with modern day shots from the same locations, and the "Talk of the Town" monthly show looks back at local headlines from 100 years ago. "If you connect with a place's history, you can connect more deeply with everything happening in the present day," Forston says.

Moving forward, Forston hopes to show that Falls Cable Access is more than just a channel, it's a versatile organization that can connect, educate, and entertain the Falls through a variety of platforms. By building more partnerships with local businesses and organizations, Forston aims to highlight the stories of everyone living in Menomonee Falls. "I'd love to see more coverage, more staff, more up-to-date equipment, and more opportunities for filming," he says. "Wherever we go, we want to build everyone in the Falls up with us."

Village Park Update

The grass is growing in, the beer garden area is taking shape, and tables, benches, bicycle racks, and refuse containers are being installed around the Falls Fest Plaza and great lawn areas at Village Park. Additional elements (including more garbage/recycling containers) will be added as orders arrive in the coming weeks.

Outside Burning

Our recent grass fire wasn't started by embers from outdoor burning but such events can occur.

Independence Day Fireworks

Nothing says summer like a fireworks display, but MFFD urges you to use caution if using fireworks at home. An adult should always be present and a garden hose or water source handy to saturate any 'duds' to keep everyone safe.

If you didn't buy the fireworks from within the Village, you may not be able to use them legally. Vendors may suggest you can use fireworks legally after obtaining a permit. This is true but the permitting process is very involved (and expensive) to ensure the safety of the residents. Below is the link to the application and the steps necessary to ensure a safe and enjoyable fireworks display.

Mowing means Knowing

More than 16,000 children and teens are hurt each year because of lawn mower injuries. Finger tips, hands, arms, legs and feet can be at risk when the person mowing is distracted, even for a split second.

If you can remember one thing to keep your kids safe, it's this: **Mowing Means Knowing – where your children are.**


Six easy mowing safety tips

- Before starting the lawn mower, know where all children are. Talk to them and be sure they stay out of the yard when someone is mowing. Keeping kids in the house is the ideal safety practice.
- If children are playing outside, designate a supervisor (not the person mowing) of the kids while the lawn mower is in use.
- Never allow a child to ride as a passenger on a riding mower.
- Teach children that lawn mowers are not toys.
- Children should be at least age 12 to operate a walk-behind mower.
- Children should be at least age 16 to operate a riding lawn mower.



A Year in Review (From the Human Perspective)

Hello everyone,

I thought it was a good idea to re-introduce myself and my four-legged partner to everyone. It has been a little over a year since K-9 Tango and I began working together. I wanted to speak to those who were not aware of the department's canine unit and to give a little bit of an update too. Tango and I have big shoes to fill after the retirement of Tyson (K-9) in 2019 whose handler was Officer Chris Harding.

Tango and I began training together in January 2020, at Jessiffany Canine Service in Iron Ridge, Wisconsin. We were paired together after Tango's trip from the Netherlands. He was born in Hungary in 2018. Tango is a male German Shepherd. We spent five weeks training together and much of that time was spent bonding and building a cohesive working partnership. We learned drug detection, article searches, tracking, building searches, vehicle extractions and apprehension work. It was extremely challenging, but I enjoyed the time learning and creating lasting memories. After the five-week training course, Tango and I were proficient enough to certify with the American Police Canine Association.

Our patrol work started in February 2020 with traffic related drug interdictions and other related work. Tango has been requested to assist other agencies around Waukesha, Milwaukee, and Washington Counties. We have assisted in the arrest of people in possession of guns and illegal drugs.

Tango and I continue to grow and improve our patrol skills. We train monthly with the Waukesha County Canine Unit. I have seen Tango mature and become more confident during deployments and scenarios. He's an excellent worker and does it all for a tennis ball!

In May, Tango and I competed against 27 other canine teams from around Wisconsin and Iowa. The 12 events included building and open area searches for people, vehicle extraction, handler protection, and drug detection. Tango and I finished eighth overall, and I am very proud of him.
