Menomonee Falls Recognized as Silver Level Wisconsin Healthy Community

The Village works on a regular basis with community partners to support the health and well-being of residents. In October, these efforts were recognized when Menomonee Falls was designated as a **Silver Level Wisconsin Healthy Community** by the UW Population Health Institute.

This recognition is awarded annually to encourage achievements in health improvement in Wisconsin communities, and to promote cooperation across multiple sectors. The Village applied for and received the healthy communities designation on behalf of **Menomonee Falls Collective Impact**. Collective Impact is a partnership of local organizations and volunteers (founded in 2016) who coordinate resources to improve the well-being of Village residents.

The designation recognizes the work of the Village of Menomonee Falls, the School District of Menomonee Falls, Menomonee Falls Police Department, Community Education & Recreation, and other community partners in promoting health in our community. Noteworthy local efforts include the Fit in the Parks program, 4k and early literacy initiatives, mental health clinics at schools, the Neighborhood Watch program, Dementia Friendly Menomonee Falls, Senior Center activities, and the development of trails and walkable neighborhoods.

The Wisconsin Healthy Communities Designation program is designed to be accessible to communities of all shapes and sizes, both rural and urban. The program uses a three-tiered approach – gold, silver and bronze – which are meant to serve as a guide for communities as they continue to strive toward better health.

Menomonee Falls' Silver Level Healthy Communities Designation shows that Menomonee Falls Collective Impact has established strong partnerships to improve health outcomes, but that there is still work to be done in setting goals and tracking measurable results for community programs. **Menomonee Falls is the only community in Waukesha County to receive a Wisconsin Healthy Communities Designation** and is one of seven in southeast Wisconsin. Winter Operations Reminders

When does Public Works come out to plow?

We have over 30 Public Works and Utilities operators that work long hours throughout the winter to ensure that our streets are plowed and treated as efficiently as possible. Snow and ice operations begin when any of the following conditions are met:

- Snow accumulation of 2" and more snow is expected
- Drifting snow is causing hazardous travel conditions
- Icy conditions are adversely affecting travel
- Time of snowfall is affecting peak travel times

What is the goal of snow and ice operations?

The immediate objective of snow and ice control operations is to maintain reasonably safe driving conditions during and following storm events. This does not, however, mean that bare pavement should be expected by motorists, nor does this mean that all streets will be free of snow and ice. Motorists and pedestrians are expected to take necessary precautions and to observe safe winter driving habits. Keep in mind that our snow and ice operations focus on the heavily-traveled roadways in Menomonee Falls, such as Main Street, Appleton Avenue, and Menomonee Avenue. All subdivisions will be plowed, but will only be salted on hills, curves, and intersections due to lower speed limits and less travel on these streets.

Will my waste and recycling collection be affected by winter weather?

Please be aware that freezing temperatures may delay waste and recycling pickup services from Waste Management. Severe temperatures can cause equipment issues which can lead to delays. Please note that waste and recycling receptacles should be placed at least 3 feet away from each other and other objects. During the winter, please use your driveway or clear an area along the side of your driveway to place your carts.

Do I have to clear the sidewalk in front of my house?

It is the owner's responsibility to clear the concrete sidewalk in front of the property and treat with salt or sand if ice has formed. The Village clears sidewalks in front of Village

property, as well as some parts of the downtown area. Asphalt trails are not considered sidewalks, so snow clearance is not required.

What else do I need to know about Winter Operations?

- Snow should not be shoveled or blown into the street
- Do not pull up behind snow plows when they are equipped and engaged for snow removal
- Snow plows may cause damage to turf adjacent to streets and sidewalks. Turf that has been damaged and reported will be repaired in the spring. The Village will not be responsible for damage as a result of the use of sand or de-icing chemicals or for damage to landscaping, sprinkler systems, or any other private items located in the public right-of-way.
- The Village encourages residents to clear the snow from any fire hydrants near your house
- Residents are asked to check the condition of their mailbox and post – in most cases, a strong post and secure mailbox will withstand the impact of snow coming off of a plow

Snow in Driveways

While removing snow from the street, some of that snow gets deposited at the ends of driveways. We recognize that this is an inconvenience, but it is unfortunately part of the snow removal process. The Public Works Department would like residents to be aware that it is illegal to push or deposit snow onto the street. To reduce the amount of snow that may end up at the end of the driveway, snow should be piled to the right side of the driveway (as you face the street).

Public Projects

Capital projects which improved public spaces, streets, and infrastructure in 2021 included the reconstruction of Main Street between Grand Avenue and Appleton Avenue, traffic signal replacement and crossing improvements at the intersection of Woosencraft Drive and Appleton Avenue, and several utility projects.

The reconstruction of Main Street was completed in November



Village Park Phase II

Plans were presented at the October 4th Village Board meeting for a second phase of improvements at Village Park to include a large-scale inclusive play area, splash pad, pickleball/tennis courts, picnic shelter, trails, and interior parking area. The project will go out to bid in early 2022 and will be funded through a combination of public dollars and a private fundraising campaign. Construction is planned for spring of 2022.



Private Sector Projects

Both the residential and commercial development sectors remained strong in Menomonee Falls in 2021 with dozens of major projects adding homes, value, and new jobs to the Village.



Menomonee Falls remained among the regional leaders for home construction in 2021. As of the end of the third quarter, the Village had issued permits for 7 percent of the new housing units constructed in the Milwaukee Metropolitan Area.

2022 General Operating Budget Overview


Key Budget Details

- Mill rate maintained at \$5.20 per \$1,000 assessed value
- 3.8% General Operating Budget increase (includes hiring three additional police officers and one firefighter)
- Village tax levy increase of 1.1%
- Garbage & recycling fee increase of \$4.68
- No sewer rate increase

Summary

The 2022 General Operating Budget was adopted on November 15, 2021 with total revenues and expenditures of \$29,881,096, which is a 3.8% increase from 2021. The budget reflects the Village's mission to provide the highest quality municipal services consistent with the changing needs and desires of the community and a realistic assessment of resources




2022 Village Tax Levy

The Village Board adopted a mill rate of \$5.20 and a tax levy of \$25,046,000. This represents an additional investment of \$271,000 from 2021.


For a typical Menomonee Falls home valued at \$300,000, the owner will pay \$1,560 in Village property taxes in 2022. At a monthly cost of \$130 for Village services, a typical property owner receives a good value compared to other common household monthly costs.

Dog Licenses

2021 dog licenses expire December 31, 2021. To license your dog, submit a completed [application for dog license](#) and a \$10 fee per dog (\$15 for unneutered/unspayed dogs) to the Clerk Services Department. After March 31, fees increase to \$15 for neutered/spayed dogs and \$20 for unneutered/unspayed dogs.

Redistricting

On October 18th, the Menomonee Falls Village Board approved a new ward map, which will be in effect for the first election in 2022. About a month before the first 2022 election, all Menomonee Falls registered voters will be mailed their new ward and polling place information. Many voters will continue going to the same polling place but some will change as we have added a new polling place - Fire Station #3 on Lilly Road. Please watch for a mailing from the Village.

Registered voters can also find their ward and polling place information by visiting myvote.wi.gov.

Now that you know the Village has approved a new ward map through the redistricting process, you may ask what is redistricting? It is the process of adjusting ward map boundaries. How often do we redistrict? Every 10 years as required by state law. The U.S. Census Bureau information is provided to municipalities, which is used by the Village to review the existing ward map boundaries and adjust the ward map.

(Please note: The Village does not draw boundaries used for candidates for Federal, State, County, or School District offices.)

Falls Cable Access Connecting the Community



"Focus on the Falls" host John Mercure

2021 has been a huge year of growth for Falls Cable Access – Menomonee Falls' local cable channel. Under the direction of Chris Forston, the channel moved its headquarters to Village Hall, incorporated new live-streaming technology, built partnerships with local organizations and establishments, and covered as many local events as possible. Throughout all of this, the mission of the channel stayed consistent: to amplify local voices in Menomonee Falls and tell the Village's stories.


A big step forward in covering those live events and sharing those stories came with streamlining the channel's live-streaming capabilities. After experimenting with a few different systems, FCAC settled on using OBS software as its primary live-streaming platform. Forston had already been pushing the channel's operations towards being tighter and more mobile, and the free software has allowed FCAC to broadcast live from virtually any location using only a laptop and phone.

FCAC used this new system to cover more local sporting events than ever before, from baseball to soccer to football to even tennis matches – a brand-new sport to be featured on the channel! This proved to be very popular among Menomonee Falls residents, who could easily watch local games in real time on YouTube, with the live-streams being uploaded to FCAC's website and broadcast on the cable channel later.

Forston and the FCAC team plan to continue developing the feature possibilities of the OBS system. Employee Robert Freyer says that "instant replays, player profiles, intro screens, and [camera] transitions" are all in the works. The team is eager to try out these new features during the upcoming high school basketball season, where Menomonee Falls looks to have one of the best teams in the state.

Looking further ahead, with COVID restrictions easing and large events returning, Forston is excited about what the channel can accomplish in 2022. "We're looking forward to live-streaming parades and more outdoor events."

Along with those live events, original FCAC content will continue, including new episodes of "Focus on the Falls" with WTMJ's John Mercure, and new episodes of the Falls history web series "Talk of the Town."

In the long term, Forston wants to keep the channel's focus on the people of Menomonee Falls. "We want to bring awareness to all the great people doing great things in our Village," Forston says. With its advancements in technology, ever-expanding list of partners, and commitment to the community, Falls Cable Access is more the prepared to do just that!

Our Mission and Commitment

Menomonee Falls Police Department



Throughout the year, we receive praise, thank you notes, food drop-offs and general words of appreciation and recognition from the public. However less frequent, we also receive citizen complaints that are thoroughly reviewed and investigated. Final dispositions of those investigations are provided to the citizens. Regardless of whether we receive praise or criticism our mission remains the same:

The mission of the Menomonee Falls Police Department is to preserve the public peace, protect persons and property, and provide services for the betterment of the community.

Our mission statement is our commitment to the public. We understand the fundamental desire and need for people to feel safe and secure in their homes, at work or when they are just out and about in the public. We understand that desire and make it our daily effort to preserve safety through our community contacts, patrol efforts and our engagement with the public on a day to day basis. We have programs and partnerships that allow us to develop these relationships. We are dedicated to our Neighborhood Watch and participate in events throughout the year. We take time to converse with the public through our 'Coffee with a Cop' events. Our Community Camera Co-Op was created specifically to partner with our citizens to enhance our ability to develop suspect information and to make our neighborhoods and businesses safer.

As our agency reflects on our mission, we are often reminded of the past events of 2020 that have occurred in the United States. Unfortunately, officers are called to the scenes of tragic, difficult, and sometimes life changing events for the citizens and officers involved. As difficult as it is for those involved, we must remember as officers to police with humanity and compassion. It is this humanity and compassion that is often times called into question when officers are involved with use of force. It is our agency's responsibility to reassure our community of our commitment to our mission and to share information for the betterment of the community.

This past August, Wisconsin enacted Act 75 which created a new statute to govern the use of force by Wisconsin law enforcement officers. This law becomes effective on January 1, 2022. It was enacted to address four areas: 1) Use of force, including the use of deadly force; 2) Duty to report noncompliant use of force; 3) Duty to intervene; and 4) Whistleblower protections.

At the very core of Act 75, the emphasis is on the sanctity of human life. As stated earlier, our bond in humanity is paramount. Many of the other requirements of Act 75 were previously addressed and trained within the Menomonee Falls Police Department. Some of the additional requirements are being incorporated into our policy. It is our hope to share this information so that our citizens are aware of these changes and we want to ensure our community trusts us and holds us accountable not only when we do things wrong, but when we do things right.

Winter Safety Tips from Menomonee Falls Fire Department



Indoor Safety

- Have furnaces checked by a professional for proper operation.
- Fireplaces should be checked by a professional as well. Burn only seasoned wood to avoid build up. Learn more about chimney fire prevention, recognition, and response at: www.firerescue1.com/chimney-fire/articles
- Use space heaters with caution. Follow directions regarding cords on electric heaters and ventilation on fuel powered heaters.
- Ensure CO (carbon monoxide) detectors are present and functioning. They do have an end of useful life date on the back – make sure it is current. Call 911 for help in locating the source and clearing an accumulation of carbon monoxide. Even small amounts can have harmful effects.
- Use extension cords with caution when decorating. Make sure they are properly rated and are for temporary use only.



Winter Driving

- Keep your gas tank full to avoid unexpected breakdowns
- Make sure your windshield wipers are in good shape and the fluid reservoir is full
- Check your tires regularly to ensure adequate tread to provide traction

Outdoor Safety

- Dress appropriately for your activity. It is easier to try to cool off than warm yourself if dressed inappropriately.
- Be careful on ladders when hanging holiday decorations. Have a ladder that is tall enough to avoid over-reaching! Make sure the ladder is on a stable surface before climbing.
- Have an assistant to help with heavy items.
- Use extension cords that are properly rated to avoid overloads.



Snow and Ice

Clear snow and ice from walks as soon as possible.

- Use caution to avoid over exertion during wet, heavy snow falls.
- If you have a hydrant in front of your property please clear a 3 foot circle around it to allow for easy access if needed.
- Shut a snowblower off before trying to clear a clog. Use the tool that came with the machine or a shovel handle to clear the clog – avoid using your hand.


