



Menomonee Falls Police Department Notable Incidents for the Month of February 2022

22-003375/3397 02-02-2022 Eluding, Stolen Auto, Resisting W180N9393 Premier Ln.

Officers located an occupied stolen auto in the Marcus Cinema parking lot. The passenger exited while the driver refused to stop. The suspect driver struck another vehicle it was parked next to as it was fleeing. The passenger then refused commands by officers and physically resisted officers and was eventually arrested. The suspect driver and vehicle were located later, but due to the reckless speed no pursuit was initiated. The suspect driver was later identified and charges for eluding, bail jumping, hit & run and operating a vehicle without owner's consent were referred to the district attorney's office.

22-003602 02-04-2022 Retail Theft, Obstructing N95 W17707 Shady Ln.

Officers responded to Target for the report of a retail theft. The suspect stole approximately \$200 worth of merchandise and fled on foot when police arrived. The suspect was caught and provided a false name which was later confirmed by verifying via a fingerprint scan. The suspect was arrested for retail theft, obstructing and two warrants through the Milwaukee County Sheriff's Office for operating an auto without owner's consent and battery.

22-003681 02-05-2022 OWI 2nd offense Wildlife Ct./Green Crane Dr.

Officers responded to the area of a possible drunk driver. The suspect was located on the side of the road inside their vehicle. The driver was asked to perform field sobriety tests and provided a PBT sample of .21. The driver was arrested for OWI 2nd offense and conveyed to the hospital where a warrant was requested and obtained to get a sample of the suspect's blood. The driver was booked and released to a sober adult.

22-003895 02-07-2022 Identity Theft N85 W1500 Block Mac Arthur Dr.

The victim contacted the police to report that an unknown suspect used the victim's identity to purchase a \$40,000 vehicle from a dealership in Brunswick, Georgia. An investigation was initiated and a Detective was assigned. The victim was also working with their financial institution. Due to limited investigative leads the case is inactive. The victim was advised by their financial institution that they will not suffer any financial loss due to the dealership's acceptance of a fraudulent application.

22-003969 02-08-2022 Battery, DC N85 W18000 Block Lawrence Ave.

Officers responded to a domestic incident in progress involving a mother and her son. The mother reported that her son broke her phone, restrained her from calling police, armed himself with a handgun and had threatened to shoot himself after the physical altercation. Several officers responded and evacuated the victim and other family members from the house. The suspect was eventually ordered out and arrested. A handgun was recovered. The suspect was booked on several charges including some felony charges and turned over to the county jail.



22-004002 02-09-2022 Eluding, OAR, Bail Jumping Pilgrim Rd./Sunny Dale Dr.

An officer responded to the report of a suspicious vehicle that was stopping at driveways with the headlights turned off at 1:30 a.m. The suspect vehicle was located which had no registration plates displayed. A traffic stop was conducted and as the officer approached the vehicle it sped off. A pursuit was initiated, but was terminated due to the reckless driving of the suspect. However, the suspect's vehicle had sustained damaged, causing it to become disabled near 124th St and Silver Spring Dr. Officers approached the stopped vehicle and took the driver into custody. The other occupant fled on foot and with the assistance of Butler PD and the West Allis canine officer, was located and detained. The suspect driver provided a false name which was discovered during a fingerprint check. The passenger was released without charges. The driver was charged with numerous offenses to include fleeing/eluding, operating after revocation (OAR), felony bail jumping and failure to install an ignition interlock device. The suspect driver was turned over to the county jail.

22-004758 02-16-2022 Eluding, Obstructing Meno Ave/Fleet Ave

Officers stopped a vehicle for an equipment violation. The driver was not wearing a seatbelt and also provided a fake name. While the driver was out of the vehicle, the suspect passenger moved to the driver's seat and fled the scene in the vehicle. Officers pursued the vehicle into Milwaukee until it crashed in the area of Sherman Blvd and W Burleigh St. The suspect fled on foot and officers were unable to take him into custody. The suspect's identity was determined and charges were forwarded to the district attorney's office.

22-004966 02-28-2022 Trespassing, Bail Jumping N88 W14800 Block Main St.

Officers responded to an apartment complex where the caller reported that a suspect was trespassing and appeared to be living in the basement. The suspect was located and a wanted check revealed two outstanding warrants. The suspect was arrested and found to be in possession of drug paraphernalia. He was booked on several charges and turned over to the county jail.

22-005648 02-25-2022 Retail Theft, Eluding N95 W18351 County Line Rd.

Officers responded to a report of a retail theft in progress. The suspect vehicle was located and stopped. The vehicle stopped momentarily as the officer gave verbal commands to the occupants to exit the vehicle. The occupants refused to cooperate and drove off. The vehicle was pursued eastbound into the city of Milwaukee. Milwaukee officers were able to assist by deploying stop sticks and deflating one of the suspect's tires causing it to slow down. The vehicle finally stopped in the 4200 block of N. 71st St. where the two occupants reside. Both occupants were taken into custody. The driver was booked on charges of eluding, resisting/obstructing, retail theft, and possession of drug paraphernalia. The driver was eventually turned over to the county jail. The passenger was booked on charges of retail theft and released.

22-005728 02-26-2022 Arson N95 W18351 County Line Rd.

Officers responded to the Metro Market for a report of a suspicious fire in the men's public restroom. The fire department also responded and the fire was extinguished. The fire damaged the bathroom as well as some other food products. Detectives responded and are actively investigating this incident.
