After March 31<sup>st</sup>, fees increase to \$15 for neutered/spayed dogs and \$20 for unneutered/unspayed dogs.

# Spring Cleaning & Service Reminders

from the Public Works Department

Spring is the perfect time of the year to clean up the yard, organize the garage, and dispose of unwanted items. The following pages include reminders about programs you can utilize to keep your property looking great in 2023. We have also included information about Village initiatives and services that support spring cleaning for the community at-large. Thank you for doing your part to keep our community clean and well-maintained!

## Bulk Item Collection

Waste Management will be conducting a bulk trash collection week again in 2023. Bulk trash includes items that don't fit in the garbage cart, exceed four feet in length, or exceed 60 pounds in weight. This collection includes up to two bulk items placed at the curbside for pickup free of charge. This will occur the first full week of May (week of May 1<sup>st</sup>). Residents looking to utilize this service need to notify Waste Management between April 10<sup>th</sup> and April 21<sup>st</sup> about their items for pick-up by calling 262-251-4000. Residents will be required to have their bulk item(s) placed at the curb by 6 am on Monday, May 1<sup>st</sup>, as the items may not be collected on your usual trash collection day. All items must be able to be loaded by two (2) people. This bulk collection does not include hazardous waste, yard waste, tires, or electronics. ## Brush Collection

The Menomonee Falls Public Works Department will begin picking up brush on Monday, May 15<sup>th</sup>.

- Brush materials acceptable for Village pickup are **branches up to six inches in diameter**, cut to a **maximum length of four feet**.
- Brush must be placed on the terrace area (between the curb and sidewalk). In areas without curb, the brush should be placed on the grass area adjacent to the street pavement or adjacent to driveway entrances. All areas should have brush placed parallel to the road.
- For safety reasons, no brush may be placed on the street pavement.
- Please note that yard waste, including grass clippings, leaves, and garden debris will not be picked up.
- No stumps, roots, or shrubs with intact root balls will be picked up.
- Any yard waste that is mixed in with your branches will not be picked up.
- Brush in containers will not be picked up, as too often there is yard waste in the bottom of the container. We encourage you to use your Yard Waste Permit and take yard waste debris (not picked up) to the Orchard Ridge composting facility. Be aware that the Orchard Ridge composting facility will no longer accept cash and accepts all major credit cards and checks.

**The deadline for residents to put out brush for pickup is Sunday, May 14<sup>th</sup>.**



# Spring Cleaning Continued...

## Yard Waste Permits

Yard Waste Permits were mailed in February to each Menomonee Falls property owner. The permit allows residents to dispose of yard waste 35 times in a season (April – December) for no fee at the Orchard Ridge composting facility. Please note: Village residents must provide identification showing proof of Menomonee Falls residency. Have your ID ready to show the scale house attendant upon arrival. If you do not arrive with a permit, all fees will be charged. All businesses are excluded from this program.

2023 Orchard Ridge Composting Facility Program  
Located at W124N9355 Boundary Road

- Acceptable forms of payment include credit card or check – cash no longer accepted
- Residents will be allowed one free visit per day. After the free visit, additional yard waste will be charged at a rate of \$0.015 per pound, minimum of \$3
- Hours of Operation: Monday through Friday, 6:30 am – 4 pm & Saturday, 7 am – 11:45 am
- No large stumps or logs over 6" will be accepted

## Recycling & Disposal Requirements

Chemicals, electronics, and appliances cannot be disposed of using your curbside collection service, so residents are encouraged to utilize the following resources to determine the most appropriate way to dispose of these types of items. A listing of various household items and instructions for disposal can be found on pages 16-19 of the [Public Works Department Resident Guide](#). Waukesha County has also compiled information on how to dispose of various electronics, and that information can be found at [www.waukeshacounty.gov/ewaste](http://www.waukeshacounty.gov/ewaste). Additionally, the University of Wisconsin-Green Bay has created a Wisconsin Recycling Markets Directory in conjunction with the Wisconsin Department of Resources which provides state-wide information about landfill diversion opportunities for various items. ## Fire Hydrant Flushing

The Village flushes fire hydrants in the spring and fall of each year, and throughout the year if necessary. Hydrant flushing improves water quality, exercises hydrants so they are in good order when needed for an emergency, removes sediment that may cause discolored water, and allows us to inspect each hydrant for defects. If you experience discoloration in your water, we recommend running the cold water for several minutes to help clear the water before use.

# Construction & Development Projects

## 2022 Year in Review

2022 was a strong year for new development and redevelopment projects in Menomonee Falls. The Village issued a total of 736 building permits, and the total estimated construction value of projects in Menomonee Falls was nearly \$165 million. Single family home construction/remodeling (\$55 million) and multifamily/senior housing projects (\$63 million) contributed the most to overall value.

Menomonee Falls ranked third among Milwaukee Area communities with 86 new single family/duplex homes constructed in 2022. The Village had the second highest new construction value in Waukesha County in 2022, and construction moved forward on major business projects for JAX Incorporated, Cintas, Tailored Label Products, SpringHill Suites hotel, and Amato Hyundai.

- 204 new apartment units
- 561 residential renovations/additions



- New construction value of nearly **\$165 million**

- Highest non-residential construction value ever **\$109.6 million**

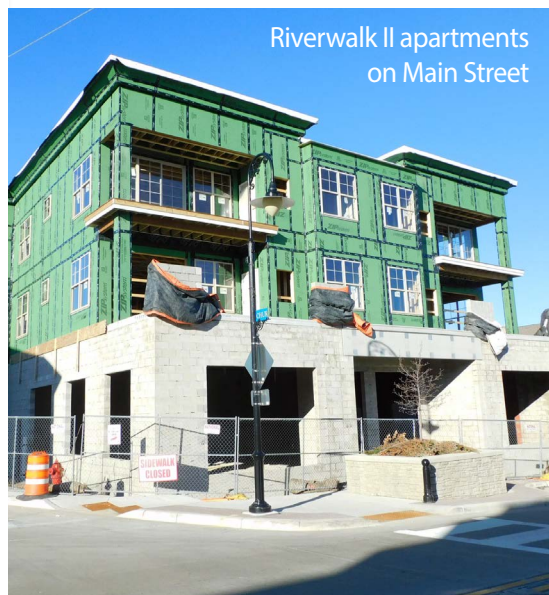

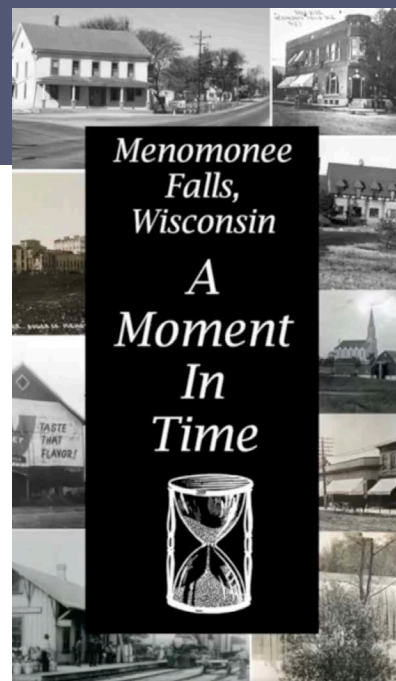


# Falls Cable Access Remembers Menomonee Falls

## Menomonee Falls Police Department & Body-Worn Cameras



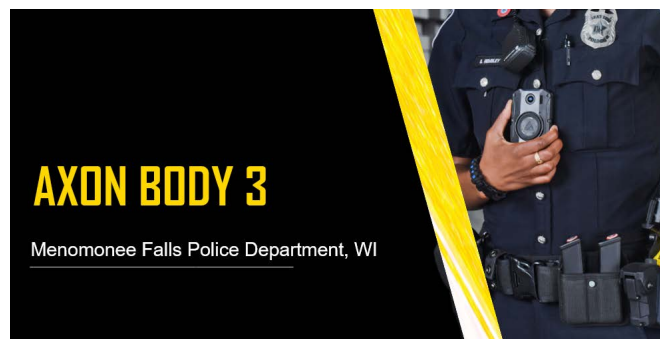
Oftentimes, the public may believe that all police departments are required to equip their officers with body-worn cameras. While many agencies do have body-worn cameras, many do not and there are no federal or state mandates requiring body worn cameras for most local law enforcement agencies.

The Menomonee Falls Police Department has had squad installed cameras since 2010. Our squad cameras have proven to be beneficial in many different aspects of policing. Video has been used as evidence in criminal arrests to include drunk driving offenses where recorded field sobriety tests are used during court proceedings. Additionally, suspects statements made during the investigation as well as evidence of traffic violations captured on squad camera have been powerful pieces of evidence in court proceedings.

The squad video recordings have also been helpful in recording citizen-police contacts. These recordings can be used to review and improve newly hired officers' interactions with the public. Furthermore, the videos have been reviewed for investigations when allegations are made against an officer for misconduct. It is this last category that often creates a strong demand of police accountability and transparency. This demand for body-worn cameras comes with a significant cost of time and money.

The Menomonee Falls Police Department is excited to announce that our agency has received a grant to assist with the purchase of body-worn cameras. This grant directly supports the Village of Menomonee Falls Body-Worn Camera Department Wide Deployment Program. On November 14<sup>th</sup>, 2022 our agency received a letter from Attorney General Joshua L. Kaul notifying us that our body-worn camera grant application was accepted and approved.

## Body Worn Cameras Continued...

This monetary (50 percent match) grant award was approved by the Wisconsin Department of Justice pursuant to 2021 Wisconsin Act 185. This act was created for the specific purpose of creating funds to be awarded to law enforcement agencies to equip all law enforcement officers with body-worn cameras who have the primary duties involving traffic patrol, beat patrol, or responding to calls from the public requiring assistance. The award time frame covers

from January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2023 through December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2025. In accepting this award our agency has committed to improve transparency and to document police-citizen contacts along with many of the same benefits our squad camera program has afforded us. This implementation will help us achieve and bolster our department values of service, respect, integrity, accountability, community, innovation, teamwork, and loyalty.

## Wisconsin Law Enforcement Accreditation

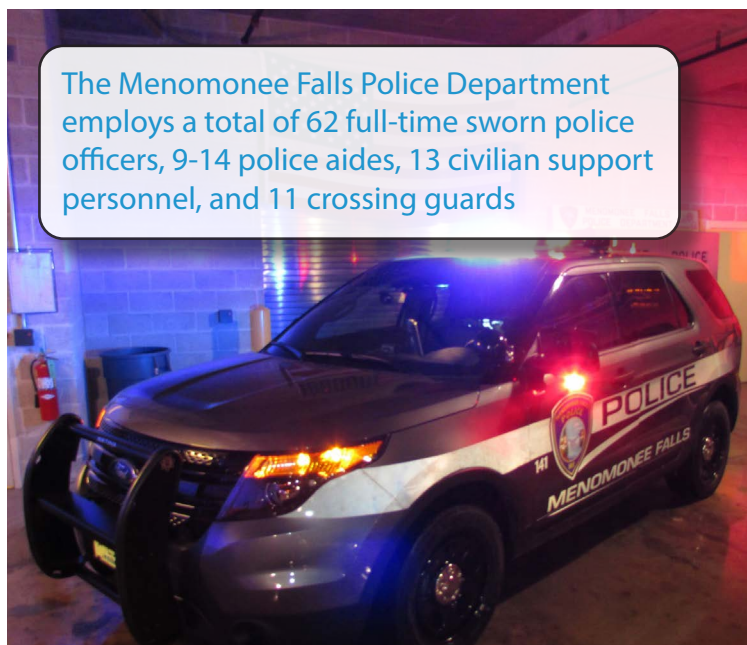
On February 14<sup>th</sup>, 2023 the Menomonee Falls Police Department had three assessors from the Wisconsin Law Enforcement Accreditation Group (WILEAG) arrive for a three-day assessment of our agency. This in-depth assessment was to determine our eligibility for WILEAG re-accreditation. This review process takes place over three days and requires the review of policies and actual proof that our agency abides by the 253 standards for the years of 2020 through 2022.

Accreditation is the most cost-effective and efficient way for an agency to assess the overall performance and service they provide to the public. The standards guide agencies to current best practices, but the process also allows agencies to identify problem areas, deficient policies, and potential areas of liability. Only about 8% of the 560 eligible law enforcement agencies in Wisconsin are fully accredited by WILEAG.

The accreditation process is no easy endeavor and requires a great deal of time, effort and commitment. The benefits of accreditation include a well-deserved sense of professionalism and pride by the agency, the agency's personnel, and the community that the agency serves. Communities gain security in the knowledge that their agencies are well managed and utilizing the best police practices in the State of Wisconsin. Prosecutors have the assurance that enforcement operations and personnel are consistently well directed. Finally, local officials know that there is an independent review and evaluation of agency operations.



The Menomonee Falls Police Department employs a total of 62 full-time sworn police officers, 9-14 police aides, 13 civilian support personnel, and 11 crossing guards

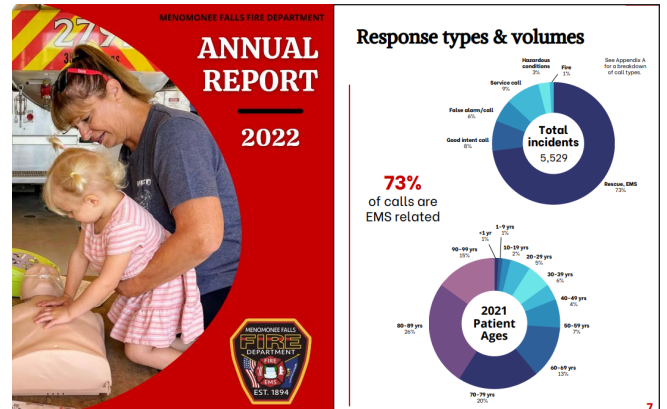
## A New Friend at Station #5
