Executive Board Report: President Cathy Mariscal asked for a motion to accept the minutes of the July 13, 2023 NW meeting. Motion was made by Marie Weber to accept the minutes and was seconded by Bonnie Lemmer. Motion was passed.

He spoke about internet crimes and scams against all citizens. Americans lost **\$8.8 BILLION** in scams last year! He provided the following ***tips to protect yourself:***

- Be aware that you are at risk.
- Don't isolate yourself – stay involved
- No phone solicitors!!!
- Use direct deposit whenever possible.
- Never give out credit card info unless you made the call.
- Be skeptical of unsolicited offers and do your research.

General prevention tips

- Check your credit reports at least once per year.
- Follow up if bills don't arrive on time.
- Purchase a shredder.
- Do not print your SSN on checks
- Do not carry your SSN in your wallet or purse.
- Keep items that contain your personal information in a safe place.

Prevention for computer users

- Password protect your computer and files that contain sensitive personal data.
- Install firewall and virus protection software.
- Encrypt files that contain personal information.
- When shopping on-line, be sure you are dealing with a reputable company.
- When disposing of your computer, use a strong "wipe" utility program to remove data, or physically destroy the hard drive.

Remember the saying, "if it's too good to be true" and proceed with caution!

Police Report: Officer Jay Weber MFPD. There have been reports of checks being stolen from mail boxes. Stolen checks are used for information and for purposes of gaining access to accounts and cash. For the holidays, be sure packages are secure and a safe place for delivery. Retail theft will spike over the holidays as well. Keep the porch / garage lights on and garage doors closed.
