## 2024 Dog Licenses

2023 dog licenses expired December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2023. To license your dog, submit a completed [Application for Dog License](#) and a \$10 fee per dog (\$15 for unneutered/unspayed dogs) to the Clerk Services Department. After March 31, fees increase to \$15 for neutered/spayed dogs and \$20 for unneutered/unspayed dogs.



# Spring Cleaning & Service Reminders

Spring is the perfect time of the year to clean up the yard, organize the garage, and dispose of unwanted items. The following pages include reminders about programs you can utilize to keep your property looking great in 2024. We have also included information about Village initiatives and services that support spring cleaning for the community at-large. Thank you for doing your part to keep our community clean and well-maintained!

## Bulk Item Collection

Waste Management will be conducting a bulk trash collection week again in 2024. Bulk trash includes items that don't fit in the garbage cart, exceed four feet in length, or exceed 60 pounds in weight. This collection includes up to two bulk items placed at the curbside for pickup free of charge. This will occur the first full week of May (week of May 6<sup>th</sup>). Residents looking to utilize this service need to notify Waste Management between April 15<sup>th</sup> and May 3<sup>rd</sup> about their items for pick-up by calling 262-251-4000. Residents will be required to have their bulk item(s) placed at the curb by 6 am on Monday, May 6<sup>th</sup>, as the items may not be collected on your usual trash collection day. All items must be able to be loaded by two (2) people. This bulk collection does not include hazardous waste, yard waste, tires, or electronics. ## Brush Collection

The Menomonee Falls Public Works Department will begin picking up brush on Monday, May 13<sup>th</sup>.

- Brush materials acceptable for Village pickup are **branches up to six inches in diameter**, cut to a **maximum length of four feet**.
- Brush must be placed on the terrace area (between the curb and sidewalk). In areas without curb, the brush should be placed on the grass area adjacent to the street pavement or adjacent to driveway entrances. All areas should have brush placed parallel to the road.
- For safety reasons, no brush may be placed on the street pavement.
- Please note that yard waste, including grass clippings, leaves, and garden debris will not be picked up.
- No stumps, roots, or shrubs with intact root balls will be picked up.
- Any yard waste that is mixed in with your branches will not be picked up.
- Brush in containers will not be picked up, as too often there is yard waste in the bottom of the container. We encourage you to use your Yard Waste Permit and take yard waste debris (not picked up) to the Orchard Ridge composting facility. Be aware that the Orchard Ridge composting facility will no longer accept cash and accepts all major credit cards and checks.

**The deadline for residents to put out brush for pickup is Sunday, May 12<sup>th</sup>.**



# Spring Cleaning Continued...

## Yard Waste Permits

Yard Waste Permits are being mailed in March to each Menomonee Falls property owner. The permit allows residents to dispose of yard waste 35 times in a season (April – December) for no fee at the Orchard Ridge composting facility. Please note: Village residents must provide identification showing proof of Menomonee Falls residency. Have your ID ready to show the scale house attendant upon arrival. If you do not arrive with a permit, all fees will be charged. All businesses are excluded from this program.

## 2024 Orchard Ridge Composting Facility Program

Located at W124N9355 Boundary Road

- Acceptable forms of payment include credit card or check – cash no longer accepted
- Residents will be allowed one free visit per day. After the free visit, additional yard waste will be charged at a rate of \$0.015 per pound, minimum of \$3
- Hours of Operation: Monday through Friday, 6:30 am – 4 pm & Saturday, 7 am – 11:45 am
- No large stumps or logs over 6" will be accepted

## Recycling & Disposal Requirements

Things like chemicals, electronics, and appliances cannot be disposed of using your curbside collection service, so residents are encouraged to utilize the following resources to determine the most appropriate way to dispose of these types of items. A listing of various household items and instructions for disposal can be found on pages 16-19 of the [Public Works Department Resident Guide](#). Waukesha County has also compiled information on how to dispose of various electronics, and that information can be found at [waukeshacounty.gov/ewaste](http://waukeshacounty.gov/ewaste). Additionally, the University of Wisconsin-Green Bay has created a Wisconsin Recycling Markets Directory in conjunction with the Wisconsin Department of Resources which provides state-wide information about landfill diversion opportunities for various items. ## Fire Hydrant Flushing

The Village flushes fire hydrants in the spring and fall of each year, and throughout the year if necessary. Hydrant flushing improves water quality, exercises hydrants so they are in good order when needed for an emergency, removes sediment that may cause discolored water, and allows us to inspect each hydrant for defects. If you experience discoloration in your water, we recommend running the cold water for several minutes to help clear the water before use.

# New Restaurants Coming to the Falls in 2024

Third Space Brewing  
will open an innovation  
brewhouse in 2024 in this  
new building near the corner of  
Good Hope Rd. & Appleton Ave.

Menomonee Falls is a growing community (we welcome around 300 - 400 new residents annually) which is one reason why the Village is a desired location for new businesses and restaurants. While there are great projects every year, there is a lot to look forward to in 2024!

## New Dining Options Across the Village

Third Space Brewing has announced plans to develop a 10-barrel innovation brewery and kitchen at a new 5,000 square foot commercial building being constructed as part of the Falls Mixed-Use project near the corner of Good Hope Road and Appleton Avenue. This will be only the second brick and mortar location for Third Space and it will feature a 112-seat indoor taproom, a covered outdoor patio, and outdoor common areas with fire pits and other amenities. Third Space is targeting a June 2024 opening. A second commercial building at the Falls Mixed-Use site is expected to be developed as a destination restaurant.

The Chocolate Factory is currently remodeling a commercial space on Main Street in the lower level of the Riverwalk on the Falls apartment building. The Chocolate Factory will offer ice cream, sandwiches, salads, and hand-scooped shakes and malts in a space immediately adjacent to the Mill Pond. They plan to offer outdoor seating and open in 2024, but the opening date is yet to be determined.

Other downtown restaurants and businesses that have recently moved into renovated spaces on Main Street and Appleton Avenue include the Lunch Box Deli, Chocolate Falls, and Batter and Mac.

Permits have also been submitted for a new Auntie Anne's Cinnabon location within the White Stone Station shopping area. This chain bakery will offer both savory soft pretzels and sweet cinnamon rolls.

# Construction & Development Update



## 2023 Year in Review

2023 was a strong year for new development and redevelopment projects in Menomonee Falls. The Village issued a total of 732 building permits, and the total estimated construction value of projects in Menomonee Falls was over \$115 million. Single family home construction/remodeling (\$59 million) and the Falls Mixed Use project (\$28 million) contributed the most to overall value.

Menomonee Falls ranked third among SE Wisconsin communities with 103 new single family/duplex homes constructed in 2023. The Village had the fourth highest new construction value in Waukesha County in 2023, and construction moved forward on major business projects for Alto-Shaam, Luther Group, Laser Center, Cintas, and Wisconsin Shower Door.

# Storm Water Utility Fee Reminder

### 2024 Storm Water Utility Fee

In order to cover the increasing cost of storm water management, the Village of Menomonee Falls is implementing a monthly Storm Water Utility Fee of \$5.74 per Equivalent Residential Unit (ERU). This fee has been applied starting in the first quarter of 2024.

One ERU fee is charged per single family home, and other properties are charged based on the amount of impervious cover that they contain. Impervious cover is calculated based on the total area of hard surfaces like rooftops, driveways, parking areas, patios, and pathways on a property.

Properties with more hard surface areas create more storm water run-off, and they are required to pay larger storm water fees (based on the number of ERUs that have been calculated).

All property owners with impervious surfaces will receive quarterly bills including the Storm Water Utility Fee for months starting with January 2024.

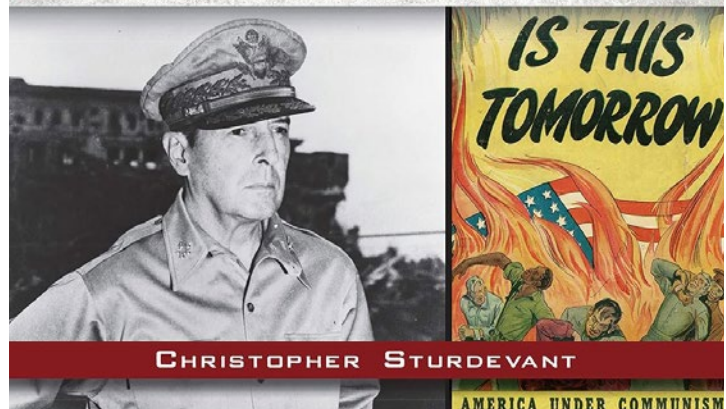
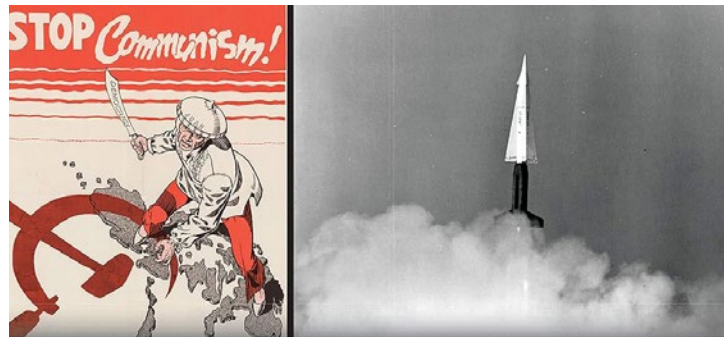
## Adult Programs

# Meet Your Police Department



The Menomonee Falls Police Department is ever changing with ongoing new additions, promotions, retirements, etc. Our department has an authorized strength of up to 65 full-time police officers, 13 civilian support personnel, and 9-14 police aides. In order to effectively serve the community, the scheduling of our department is spread out over three different shifts. Each year we have shift meetings to discuss numerous topics along with taking a photo of that specific unit. Below we would like to introduce the members of our department who serve the citizens of Menomonee Falls.



## Day Shift Patrol:

Day shift is comprised of one Lieutenant, two Sergeants, and several officers. They handle a variety of calls and are generally the most veteran officers of the department.



## Early Shift Patrol:

With the addition of K9 Tango, this shift is similar in structure to Day shift patrol and handles the highest volume of calls. Early shift has the largest staffing for this reason. As a result, this shift contributes to well-rounded and quickly experienced officers.



## Late Shift Patrol:

The staffing structure is the same as Early & Day shift. Late shift calls for service vary, but many involve dealing with intoxicated persons. Many serious crimes also occur during the hours of darkness, such as burglaries. Regardless, serving during the overnight hours can be quite challenging.



## Patrol Bureau Support Unit:

This unit consists of a Sergeant and two Crash Investigators who are primarily responsible for traffic enforcement and crash investigation. They also specialize in commercial motor vehicle enforcement.



## Meet Your Police Department Continued...



### Special Investigations Bureau:

This group consists of a Lieutenant, Sergeant, Detectives, and Juvenile Officers. Their schedules overlap with the patrol shifts and are responsible for investigating the most serious and sensitive crimes. The Juvenile officers are focused in the schools and teach D.A.R.E. to our younger students.



### Services Bureau:

This unit is comprised of a Lieutenant, Sergeant, Services Bureau Coordinator, and an IT Specialist. They are in charge of a vast array of duties that provide logistical and technical support to all police bureaus. The Services Bureau is in charge of the training activities for all department personnel along with equipping, purchasing and maintenance of all vehicles & equipment.



### Business Office Operations Unit:

Within the Services Bureau is the Business Office Operations Unit. This work group is part of our professional staff located in our front business office. There is a civilian Office Operations Supervisor who oversees three shifts of Police Support Specialists. They help by providing customer service to the public, typing reports, updating forms, forwarding cases to the DA's Office, and the list goes on and on with this team.



### Office of the Chief:

The Chief of Police, his administrative assistant, and two Captains comprise the Office of the Chief. The Chief has overall authority of the department. One Captain has oversight of the department's operations and the other Captain is in charge of tasks related to the support of the department.



# Updates from the Menomonee Falls Fire Department

## The Chief is Here!!

The Village of Menomonee Falls has selected Joe Pulvermacher to lead the Menomonee Falls Fire Department. Chief Pulvermacher has 35 years in the fire service, starting with the Butler Fire Department in 1988. He rose to the rank of Battalion Chief with the Oak Creek Fire Department before taking the Chief's job in the Madison suburb of Fitchburg WI, a community remarkably similar to Menomonee Falls.

He claims he has known since he was young that he was meant to be in the Fire Service (see photo at right). In addition to his achievements in the fire service, a favorite activity is vocal music, having performed the National Anthem at Miller Park. Chief Pulvermacher is eager to return to his roots and continue on the path to making Menomonee Falls a safer community.

## FLIR Thermal Imaging Camera

This MFFD recently purchased three new cameras to replace our old thermal imaging cameras (TICs) that were failing and becoming too costly to maintain. The new cameras have additional features to allow for changes to the scale of the temperature being measured. This is important if we are searching for a person in a generally cooler environment or troubleshooting a hot spot such as a burnt out motor or transformer in a building. MFFD crews use this to locate and gauge the size of a fire. It is also useful to minimize unnecessary damage when looking for extension of fire within the walls.

In the photo (at right) Lieutenant Ed Burg is leading the department in the orientation for FLIR thermal imaging cameras. LT Burg is the bright spot on the lower left side of the TIC screen. Note that the presentation is not seen on the TIC screen, but the structure inside the wall appears, showing the temperature difference or heat signature of the building materials in the wall. It's like having Superman's X Ray vision!



## SAFER Grant Recruit Class

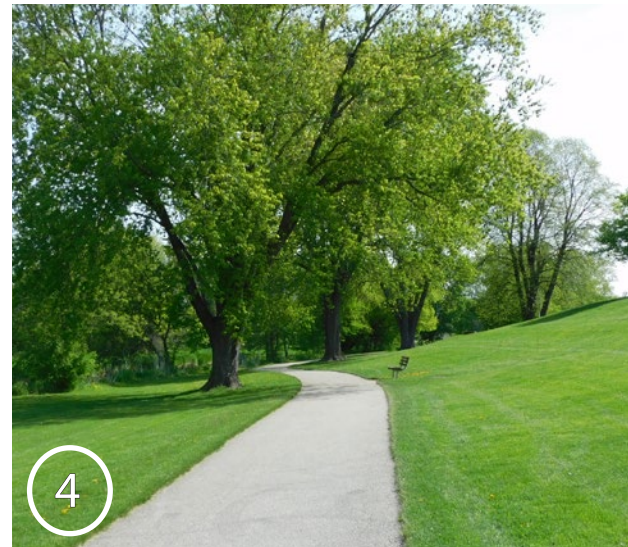
Menomonee Falls Fire Department has seven more recruits currently in field training to conclude the SAFER (Staffing For Adequate Fire and Emergency Response) Grant hiring. These firefighters joined the previous class of seven in the field on March 10<sup>th</sup>. The SAFER Grant helps us meet the growing demand in calls for service. In 2023 the MFFD responded to almost 5,400 calls and the number keeps going up!
