



Menomonee Falls Police Department Notable Incidents for the Month of July 2024

24-015331 07-01-2024 Possession of Cocaine & Fentanyl and Drug Paraphernalia, Resisting Obstructing, Bail Jumping, Warrants Appleton Ave./Ridge Rd.

Officers responded to the report of a suspicious vehicle reporting that the occupants that had just purchased drugs in Milwaukee and one of the known occupants had a valid arrest warrant. Officers located the vehicle parked and contacted the occupants who appeared to be hiding something in the vehicle and quickly walked away. One occupant lied about his name, after providing his real name he was found to have three outstanding warrants and three open criminal cases. He was arrested for obstructing by providing a false name. During the investigation a police K9 alerted on the vehicle and a search revealed a crack cocaine pipe. The owner of the crackpipe was arrested and during her arrest she attempted to conceal a small balloon containing cocaine in her pants. This same suspect tried to discard small paper wrapped drugs in the backseat of the squad. Both suspects were booked on numerous charges and transported out to the Waukesha County jail.

24-015920 07-08-2024 Operating While Intoxicated 2nd, Operating After Revocation, Warrant Arrest US Hwy 41/Main St.

Officers were dispatched to a single vehicle accident on the highway and that the driver was a younger male walking in the area with blood on his face. Officers contacted the suspect who admitted to drinking, but initially denied driving. A search of the damaged vehicle located a driver's license of the suspect who the officers were on the scene with. One of the officers noted the odor of intoxicants on the subject. A check of the driver revealed he had one prior OWI conviction, a revoked driver's license and two valid warrants through Waukesha PD. Field sobriety tests were administered and the driver was eventually arrested for OWI and the outstanding warrants, was issued several citations, booked and transported out to the Waukesha County jail.

24-016019 07-09-2024 Vehicle Theft W136 N6300 Block Cobblestone Dr.

An officer responded to a report of a vehicle theft. The victim advised their vehicle, which was left unlocked with the keys inside, was stolen around 2:30 a.m. The vehicle, through a GPS application, was located unoccupied in the 4500 block of North 26th St. in Milwaukee. Milwaukee PD was notified to search for the vehicle and an evidence technician from our agency was also sent to process the vehicle for evidence. The vehicle was recovered and returned to the owner, but not all the property was recovered. Numerous other police agencies had similar thefts and are working together to identify potential suspects through evidence obtained. This case is actively being investigated.

24-016507 07-14-2024 Carrying Concealed Weapon, Possession of Marijuana N95 W18200 Block County Line Rd.

An officer stopped a vehicle for having expired registration that expired in October of 2023. The driver was contacted and the officer noted the smell of marijuana from the vehicle. The driver did not have a driver's license and admitted to using marijuana earlier in the day. The driver was asked to step from the vehicle for a probable cause search. The driver then admitted that there was a Glock handgun underneath the passenger seat. The officer retrieved the loaded handgun and found additional marijuana in a vape pen. The driver did not have a CCW permit and was arrested, booked, posted bond and was released.



24-016900 07-18-2024 Fleeing/Eluding Appleton Ave./Good Hope Rd.

Officers responded to a FLOCK alert on a stolen Subaru reported out of Milwaukee. The vehicle was located and the officer attempted to stop the vehicle. The vehicle fled at a high rate of speed and a pursuit was initiated. Due to the suspect vehicle's speed and recklessness the officer discontinued the pursuit. This case remains unsolved due to the inability to identify the occupants. Milwaukee PD was advised on this information.

24-017362 07-23-2024 Operating While Intoxicated 3rd, Operating After Revocation, Bail Jumping N56 W16000 Block Silver Spring Dr.

Officers responded to a report of a suspicious vehicle parked in front of a residence. The occupants had exited the vehicle and were yelling at the resident about being lost. Officers arrived and observed the vehicle was parked on the curb. The occupants were contacted and the officer noted two of the occupants were identified as juveniles. The officer then spoke to the driver and who showed signs of impairment and had difficulty answering questions. The driver was put through field sobriety tests and eventually arrested for OWI 3rd offense. His driver's license was revoked and he had open criminal cases (both felony and misdemeanor) and was in violation of those bail restrictions. A warrant was obtained for a forced blood draw. The suspect driver was booked, issued numerous citations and transported out to the Waukesha County jail.
