


As the Snow Falls...



We are no strangers to snow and ice here in Menomonee Falls, but the Public Works Department wants to give all residents a few reminders to make sure winter operations run smoothly all season long.

- * The immediate objective of snow and ice control operations is to maintain reasonably safe driving conditions during and following storm events. This does not, however, mean that bare pavement should be expected by motorists, nor does this mean that all streets will be free of snow and ice. Motorists and pedestrians are expected to take necessary precautions and to observe safe winter driving habits.
- * Snow should not be shoveled or blown into the street
- * The Fire Department and Water Utilities Department ask that residents remove the snow from around their fire hydrants to help with emergency operations
- * It is the property owner's responsibility to make sure the sidewalk in front of your property is clear of snow and ice
- * Snow should be shoveled to the right side of your driveway as you face the street and snow from the sidewalk should be shoveled into the front yard rather than the terrace area between the sidewalk and the curb





- * Waste and Recycling containers must be placed in your driveway or front yard at least 3 feet away from each other and any other objects—containers can **not** be placed in the roadway
- * Waste and Recycling collection may be affected if our area is experiencing severely low temperatures
- * Residents are asked to move parked vehicles off of the streets prior to snowfall events in order for the Public Works Department to more quickly and efficiently clear the streets
- * In most cases, a strong post and secure mailbox will withstand the impact of snow coming off the snowplow, so residents are asked to check the condition of their mailbox
