I need to start my message with a big THANK YOU from the Menomonee Falls Police Department. With the help of Neighborhood Watch and many of you attending the event on March 17, 2018 at Davian's, Leadership Menomonee Falls presented the department with a check for \$10,518 for our next canine officer! I continued to be honored and humbled by the outpouring of support we receive from our citizens and businesses. Our current K-9, Tyson will retire within less than 2 years so it was important for us to plan for the future of the program.

Well we finally made it through another Wisconsin Spring! As

summer approaches I want to remind everyone that we have more kids and people in general outside walking, jogging, and riding bikes so please be extra careful when driving. It has also come to our attention that some of the IRS phone scams are resurfacing. If you receive one of these calls and they tell you to comply or local law enforcement will come and arrest you, it is a scam! Believe me when I say if we were coming to arrest you, we would not have someone call to tell you before we do it. If any of your neighbors talk about one of these calls and is not sure what to do, please let them know. Also, you can always call the police department to ask whether something is legitimate or not. Nothing should be demanded immediately and your personal or banking information should never be given over the phone without knowing who is on the other end.

You may be aware that the Governor set aside \$100 million for school safety. These funds are for grants to help schools in the State build better security around

the physical structure of the building to mitigate the loss in a mass shooting crisis. I want to assure you that Menomonee Falls Protective Services works very hard with our school district to ensure we have the best preparation in the event of a crisis. In order for schools to get any of the funds, they must work hand in hand with law enforcement to come up with plans that make sense. We have a great working relationship with the district and review plans on a regular basis. We have worked with them regarding the school grant program and fully support the requests of the School District.

I wish you all a safe and great summer. I look forward to seeing everyone at the Neighborhood Watch Picnic coming up. Thank you for being part of such a great organization and assisting us in having one of the safest communities in the State for our size.
